Here are the supplies you will need;

- 3 plastic two pocket folder with metal prongs
- 1 large zippered mesh pouch (Science)
- 5 pencils sharpened and labelled (no mechanical pencils)
- Large eraser
- 2 blue or black pens (no clicking pens)
- 1 red pen (no clicking pens)
- 2 highlighters
- 1 small handheld self-contained sharpener (*pictured above*)

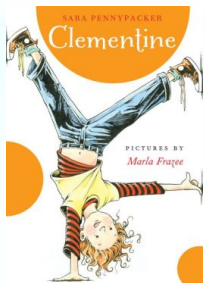
Summer Reading Suggestions

Why not try authors that they have explored during third grade;

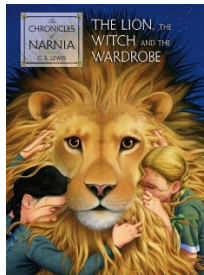
- Dan Gutman (Weird School Series)

Check out these interesting reads!



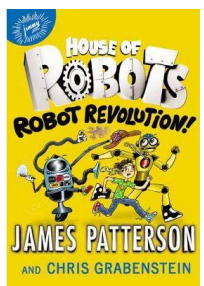
Clementine – by Sara Pennypacker
